



The Timeless Charm!

Built during a time when Egypt was one of the richest and most powerful civilizations in the world, the pyramids - especially the Great Pyramids of Giza - are some of the most magnificent man-made structures in history. Their massive scale reflects the unique role that the pharaoh, or king, played in ancient Egyptian society.



Fun facts on the Great Pyramids of Giza

- One of the astonishing facts about it is that it took almost 20 years to complete the stunning structure of the pyramids.
- ◆ As King Khufu built it for himself, he also established two more pyramids, one for his son and one for his grandson.
- ♦ It is estimated to weigh around 5.7 million tons, and is made up of around 2.3 million stone blocks. The base of the pyramid covers about 13 acres of land.
- ◆ It is one of the oldest surviving monuments in the world estimated to be built more than 4,500 years ago.
- ♦ It is one of the most visited and popular tourist sites in the entire world, attracting more than 14 million tourists every year.

Ladies Masjid



Inspired by the pure white garden furniture in European countries, "Bagh-e-Noor" a luncheon & relaxation hub for AHI academy students & non praying ladies has especially been curated. 10 beautiful concrete circular white tables with 40 semicircular white benches now adorn the red cobble flooring of the masjid backyard.

With large green planters lending an additional charm, its truly refreshing to hear the chirping of birds here. And with the swaying eucalyptus tree branches generating cool breeze this is yet another milestone accomplished by the AHI Ladies Prayer Hall Committee.

The Holy month of Ramzan saw both masjid halls packed with musallis. Quran-e-Sherief's are now cladded with burgundy velvet coverings to give them uniformity.

Two electric-new water coolers donated by benevolent musallis generate cool breeze to the masjid courtyard which houses the kiddy's creche. Toys are frequently replaced as old ones get discarded.

Bakhoor & Loban incenses were lit all through Taraveeh, Eid & Jumma Namaz making the masjid smell ethereal!

Marble water bodies & green palms have been added to the centre of the entrance ramp. All the periphery planter boxes were cleared & new plants planted.

Many tiny droplets put together form a vast ocean. It is indeed rewarding when visiting musallis experience and praise the tranquil ambience, peace and comfort that they feel at the masjid. Alhamdulillah!

Boys' Home

"The best education happens when engaged in everyday living."

The Boys Home endeavors to maintain a healthy balance in all aspects of the boys' lives, whether academics, deeniyath, or sports. Regular tuitions, bayaans, motivation, career guidance, and counseling sessions continued. The Quran Recitation Program was expanded for Classes VI to XII to improve proficiency in recitation and hifz.



The boys participated in several events like the Future Scientist program conducted by VIT Vellore, the Bhumi Ignite Festival and The Afaf Way-EPL Quiz. There were visits to the Chennai Book Fair and the Anna Arivalayam Book Fair. Several books were added to our library. New study tables were procured for the study area. New games like Drop Roball were introduced to the boys.



Three of our boys were selected for the Road Safety Parade and participated in the Republic Day celebration at the Secretariat.

Recognition for the boys and staff continues through monthly "Star of the Month" and "Employee of the Month" awards.

The health of the children continued to be a priority. Regular skin and eye checkups were done. A preventive care workshop for the staff and a drug awareness session for senior boys was conducted. A medical camp was held for the new admission boys. Medical attender

coats with the AHI logo were provided to the Health Wardens.



During the December holidays, all the boys were treated to a day of fun at the VGP amusement park. Art, craft, and games competitions were also conducted.

The annual Boys Home Ramzan Iftar was a grand affair attended by several guests including the Bangladesh Dy. High Commissioner Mr. H. E. Shelley Salehin and Income Tax Commissioner Dr. (Mr.) Shakir Hussain. A skit from the story of Prophet Moses was the highlight of the program.

Eid-ul-Fitr and Eid-ul-Adha were celebrated with delicious biryani and yummy sweet treats.



The Boys Home Alumni meet was hosted in February 2023 and almost 200 of our alumni spent the day interacting with the management, wardens, teachers, and boys. It was a day of much reminiscing and gratitude.

Alhamdulillah another batch of boys passed their class XII exams. A farewell party was hosted for them. Subsequently, they were assisted in joining colleges.

The new academic year started with a workshop for the wardens which included sessions on personal and professional development, understanding the mind of children from disturbed homes, health issues related to infant malnutrition, and discussions with other institutions who are experienced in preventive system of education and child care.

The new admission children started coming in May while the rest of the boys came back in June.





Girls' Home

Children often become separated from their parents due to poverty, which prevents them from receiving adequate care. Many single parents are unable to provide sufficient care, so AHI Girls Home is the place where the wellbeing of such children is taken care of.



Our honourable President graciously donated 320 pairs of branded shoes, ensuring that every child in the home experiences dignity and comfort. In addition, two sets of dormitory dresses were provided to enhance their living standards.

To nurture spiritual growth among the girls, Moulana Fayaz Alam Sahib regularly visits and oversees the Quran reading of the children.

Inter-School competitions

Highlights of their involvement include:

May her legacy of love and care continue to inspire us all.








Al-Hira Model School

Celebrating our Victories!

Alhamdulillah, for the second consecutive year, Al-Hira has been honored with the Literary Leadership Award by Bribooks at the National Young Authors Fair-2023, securing the 29th position in All India Ranking.



In a notable achievement, Minha Faseeh of Class IV has been recognized as the Best-Selling Author in both the city and the state for her book "Enchanted Whispers," earning her the prestigious Globally Published Young Author Certificate. Further, Ihsaan Hazim of Class VII and Abdul Ahad of Class III have been awarded with the Silver Star Young Author title for their books "Roots-Route for Success" and "A Detective Story" respectively.



Our students excelled in The Afaf Way Essence Premier League, an Inter-School Islamic quiz competition held during the month of Ramadhan, outshining 3000 participants from 12 schools. Aseena Arafath of Class IX and Shaziya Wafeeqa of Class XI, secured the First and Second positions, with 10 students from Al-Hira ranking among the top 20 performers.

A commendation programme was organized for the students of the Special Hifz Programme (Class III) to honour them for their dedication and efforts in achieving the set-target.




In the Board exams of 2024, our students continued their tradition of excellence with a 100% pass rate. In Class XII, all students achieved First Class, with 75% securing distinctions. Maryam Liyaur Rahman (95.4%), Zainabu Thahira (93.2%), and S M Mohammed Yousuf (92%) emerged as the top performers.

In Class X, 97% of the students secured First Class, with 65% earning distinctions. The top scorers are Madiha Amthul Azeez (97%), Syeda Hafsa and Ruba Zainab (96.2%), and Mohammed Abdul Sattar (95%).

In the STEM Silver Zone Olympiad exam, Shoaib Badshah from Class II achieved First place in the State-level.

These achievements reflect our students' dedication, hard work, and the unwavering support of our management, staff and parents.

winning prizes for their outstanding performance.



Seminar with viva for the BAIS students was conducted from 18th to 21st Dec 2023.


Diploma in Psychology - First Semester Exams were conducted from 8th Jan to 12th Jan 2024.

Kalongi

Kalongi or Black cumin seeds come from the plant Nigella sativa. They have a miraculous healing ability and are traditionally used to treat a variety of ailments.



Abu Huraira (ra) has said - "I have heard from RasoolAllah (pbuh) that "There is a cure for every disease in black seeds except death, and black seeds are shooneez."

Kalongi is used as a remedy for health problems such as cholesterol, inflammation, congestion, arthritis, etc. Black seed oil is beneficial for treating acne, psoriasis and wounds. Health care specialists recommend their patients to use kalongi in specified proportions in their diet as a supplement to enhance their immunity.

Admission to Homes



The process of Admission to the two homes in Anjuman is a long drawn process, involving numerous personnel who put in several hours of untiring efforts. Admission process for the year 2024 was initiated in the month of February. The Admission to Homes committee began their work with a first meeting on 24th Feb 2024. Distribution of Information sheets, admission pamphlets and application forms commenced on 1st Mar 2024 in the Mosques and School areas. Upon receiving the filled in application forms, they were divided amongst the members according to their chosen localities. Each member visited his designated applicant's houses and verified their authenticity.

The children both girls and boys came to the Homes with their parents/guardians on the appointed date 4th and 11th May 2024 for the final interview after completing the evaluation of educational standards and medical test. The final selection was made by the Chairman of the Committee, the President, Secretary and Treasurer. Out of 182 applications received, 157 applicants were found to be eligible for admission (83 Boys & 74 Girls).



As already planned, remedial classes were conducted for

the newly admitted children at the primary school. Required number of wardens and caregivers were also engaged during the children's stay in the Homes during the vacation period. Before the reopening of the school an Orientation program was conducted for the teachers highlighting the plan of action for the new academic year.

Mohammedali Currim Chagla (1900 To 1981)

M.C. Chagla, a legal legend, rose to prominence as the first permanent Chief Justice of the Mumbai High Court after India's independence. Though born into a wellestablished business family, law was his calling. He earned his law degree and went on to become a Professor of Constitutional



Law at the prestigious Government Law College in Mumbai. His exceptional legal mind and commitment to fairness were quickly recognized, leading to his election as both a member of the Bar Council and its Honorary Secretary.

Chagla's contributions extended far beyond the courtroom. He played a pivotal role in India's international standing by being part of the very first Indian delegation to the United Nations. His reputation for integrity and impartiality made him the ideal choice to head a one-man commission investigating a major scandal involving the Life Insurance Corporation (LIC). This case involved Haridas Mundhra and even T.T. Krishnamachari, a close associate of then Prime Minister Nehru. Despite the political influence at play, Chagla remained unwavering in his pursuit of the truth.

Chagla's dedication to public service didn't stop there. He later served as India's Ambassador to the USA, strengthening diplomatic ties with a key ally. He then went on to become the Indian High Commissioner to the UK, further solidifying India's position on the world stage. Throughout his career, his clear and concise legal judgments garnered him immense respect within the legal community. He is still remembered as a towering figure and an inspiration for generations of lawyers in the Mumbai High Court.
